

Some Kinship Terms and Possessive Phrases

1. nu men Joe Fresh.
 nu menulh Joe Fresh. (deceased) (=ulh suffix for deceased)

Joe Fresh tthunu men. (he's in view)
 Joe Fresh kwthunu men. (he's not in view)
 Joe Fresh kwthunu menulh. (he's deceased)

2. nu ten Josie Fresh.
 nu tenulh Josie Fresh.

Josie Fresh thunu ten. (she's in view)
 Josie Fresh lhunu ten. (she's not in view)
 Josie Fresh lhunu tenulh. (she's deceased)

3. nu si'lu John Smith.
 nu si'leelh John Smith. (deceased)

John Smith tthunu si'lu. (he's in view)
 John Smith kwthunu si'lu. (he's not in view)
 John Smith kwthunu si'leelh. (he's deceased) (si'lu + ulh contracts to
 si'leelh or si'le'elh)

4. nu si'lu Jane Smith.
 nu si'leelh Jane Smith. (deceased)

Jane Smith thunu si'lu. (she's in view)
 Jane Smith lhunu si'lu. (she's not in view)
 Jane Smith lhunu si'leelh. (she's deceased)
