## Island Place Names handout

The branch of linguistics that studies geographical place names is called toponymy. As all other names, toponyms are an essential part of the language vocabulary. All humans tend to name places that are important or for some reason meaningful to them, and in general place names are only rarely get random labels, but in most cases they can be understood and interpreted through the cultural lenses of the specific ethno-linguistic group of people, and this is especially true in the case of geographical names.

European place names in many cases refer to various historical events or persons, who are perceived as community heroes or who made notable contributions to the society.

On the other hand, the indigenous place names reveal the spiritual knowledge and experience that have been passed down through generations, as well as human's desire to be connected to its land, its traditions and its cultural beliefs. Many of these place names should be understood metaphorically, and not literally, as shown in the examples below. These namings can conserve elements of languages that have vanished without leaving traces elsewhere. Thus, they can 'permit historical inferences about languages and the people who spoke them' (Campbell 2013: 436) for a given area.

Hul'q'umi'num' place names can be organized into several semantic groups based on their morphological analyses. There are numerous place names associated with flora/fauna, landscape, human body parts, human activities, etc.
